Programs include a BS in homeland security; an MS in cybersecurity policy and risk management (online) and two new MS degrees in Global Conflict and Human Security, and National Security Intelligence Analysis, both online and expected summer 2021; minors in corporate security, forensic accounting, global studies, history, intelligence, political science, public history, and terrorism studies.
